A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF KEAN UNIVERSITY

From my point of view, it's impossible to add up all the exciting developments at Kean University and not conclude that this institution is on a dramatic upward trajectory.

We are particularly excited about the progress being made in China at our Wenzhou-Kean campus. As of this writing, three out of a planned seven buildings are built and operational: a student residence hall, dining hall, and general education building. Nearly 450 students from both China and Kean USA attended the fall semester; by 2017, we project that there will be 5,000 students on that campus. In October 2013, representatives from the Middle States Commission on Higher Education traveled to China for a site visit, and on November 21, 2013, formal approval was granted to Wenzhou-Kean as an additional, accredited location of the University—a huge milestone achieved.

We are watching our graduate programs grow by leaps and bounds. Our third doctoral program, in Nursing Leadership Education, started accepting its first students in spring 2014. Our existing doctoral programs in Urban Leadership and School and Clinical Psychology are thriving. In 2013, our Psy.D. students entered the national clinical internship match system for the first time, with a 100% success rate; every Kean doctoral student obtained an internship. By comparison, the national match rate was only 75%.

Our STEM program, now in its tenth year at Kean, is one of the most rigorous in the state. In defiance of conventional wisdom and stereotypes, more than half of the students in the program are women and minorities. As if that weren't impressive enough, we have a four-year graduation rate second only to one institution in New Jersey: Princeton.

We continue to lead the state of New Jersey in teacher education; two consecutive New Jersey Teachers of the Year are alumni of Kean. We are redefining business education with the creation of a Global Business School. We are building unique and superior programs in performing and visual arts, filling the University's world-class galleries and concert halls with artists that reflect our commitment to diversity, human rights, and community service.

It's an exhilarating time for us at Kean, and I am gratified to see the results of all that is being done on behalf of our hardworking students. The school they graduate from will be very different from the school they entered just a few years before.

And as the word filters out about the growth and dynamism of Kean University, they will find doors of opportunity swinging wide open before them.

If you're reading this annual report, it's likely that your name is included somewhere in our donor listings, and for this, I give you my most heartfelt thanks. Your support is critical to making our physical and programmatic transformations possible. I hope you continue to partner with us at Kean University on our upward journey toward educational excellence.

KEAN UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION WELCOMES NEW BOARD MEMBER KEVIN ALTON '73 H'07

The Kean University Foundation has added a new member to its Board of Directors: Kevin B. Alton '73 H'07. Alton began serving a four-year term on the Foundation Board on July 1, 2013.

Alton is well known to many at Kean as one of the University's most dedicated and active alumni. He and his wife Beth (Class of 1970) are the benefactors of the Kevin and Beth Alton Annual Scholarship as well as an endowed scholarship with the same name. In 2013, he was honored with Kean's Distinguished Alumni Award. Several years earlier, in 2007, he received an honorary Doctor of Laws degree at Kean's Commencement.

Alton is retired from a 40-year career in pharmaceutical research, the last 30 of which were spent at Schering-Plough Research Institute. His *curriculum vitae* includes more than 90 scientific journal articles, meeting abstracts, and book chapters covering analytical methods employed for the detection, quantitation, and characterization of drugs in biological matrices, as well as the definitive metabolic disposition of many market-leading drugs. His name appears as the co-inventor on at least six patent applications held by Schering Corporation (now Merck).

In 2006, Alton and two other colleagues were honored with the Discoverer's Award from the Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers Association (PhRMA), the most prestigious scientific tribute from the pharmaceutical industry's trade association. The associated research, spanning more than 10 years, began with the discovery of the active agent in Zetia, a cholesterol absorption inhibitor which is now marketed as a leading treatment for hyperlipidemia.

Alton continues to nurture his love of nature and science by maintaining his own backyard observatory, the UnderOak Observatory, at his home in Cedar Knolls, New Jersey. His photometric research on an assortment of variable star systems and asteroids is publicly available on his website, www.underoakobservatory.com.

The Foundation, and the University, are pleased to be the beneficiaries of Alton's continued commitment to his alma mater.

“Twenty years ago, I didn’t know anything about Kean University,” says Rob Busch H’03. What a difference a couple of decades makes. Today, Busch is one of Kean’s most dedicated supporters—a director and executive committee member of the Kean University Foundation, a scholarship donor several times over, and the namesake of the Robert Busch School of Design

A Most Impressive Benefactor

Busch is the owner and chief executive officer of All-State Legal, a Cranford, New Jersey-based provider of office supplies, stationery, and marketing materials to the legal industry nationwide. He describes himself as having basically been cajoled into assisting in a capital campaign to raise funds for Kean’s Nancy Thompson Library about 20 years ago.

“Over time, I got more and more involved,” says Busch. “The more I saw of Kean’s vision—to provide a quality, affordable education—I came to believe in that mission. Kean’s costs are reasonable compared with the other New Jersey state universities, but still, over the years the cost of a university education keeps going up. The demographic segments who attend Kean need financial help.

“Having attended a number of Kean commencements, and seeing the outpouring of support from graduates’ families—there had to be at least six or seven guests accompanying each graduate—brothers, sisters, uncles, aunts, mothers, fathers, whatever—it just amazed me, the adulation for these first-time university graduates by their families. That really sucked me in.”



Busch is a faithful attendee of the annual Cougar Cup Golf Classic and supports Kean in many other ways besides his financial contributions. His relationship with RBSD goes way beyond simply having his name on the school. He feels a responsibility, as an owner of a business that relies heavily on graphics, to help guide the design students, whom he describes as “the future specifiers of what process and what graphics is going to look like.”

He has a close relationship with Professor Rose Gonnella, the executive director of RBSD, and attends the annual presentations of the senior students’ portfolios. “I go to that every year, and I go from one table to the next, looking at the portfolios, and I always ask the students, ‘Well, okay, that’s a really cool design, but how would you *produce* that?’ I want to make sure they know about process, because whatever they design has to be *produced*. Understanding production, I think, is very important. So Rose and I have kind of formed a bond to try and help them better understand process, whether it be high-end engraving, whether it be offset, whether it be letterpress, whatever it is—it’s important to me that they not only understand design, they understand that somebody’s going to have to produce their ideas.”

Busch makes a point of emphasizing how impressed he is with Professor Gonnella and her staff, “not just in relation to their teaching prowess, but also the work they have produced through the Kean Cre8tive design studio for various clients, especially the textbook *Design to Touch*, for the International Engraved Graphics Association.” (See more about *Design to Touch* in the following story.)

Taking his support of the design students a step further, Busch recently created two new scholarships for design students: the Robert Busch Annual Scholarship in Design, and the Robert Busch Annual Scholarship in Design for Incoming Freshmen. Both scholarships were awarded for the first time in fall 2013.

“I get letters from students, and they’re very appreciative of the support they’ve gotten. But I know deep down, if they got even more support, that would be a really good thing,” Busch says.

THE ROBERT BUSCH SCHOOL OF DESIGN

A Mutually Rewarding Partnership

Professor Rose Gonnella, executive director of the Robert Busch School of Design (RBSD), steps off the elevator on the fifth floor of RBSD’s new home: the brand-new Green Lane Building on Kean’s Union campus. She calls a visitor’s attention to a blank expanse of wall adjacent to the elevators and adjoining a floor-to-ceiling wall of

windows through which a class of drawing students can be viewed. “That’s where I want it to go, lit from the bottom by floodlights,” she says. She’s referring to the Robert Busch School of Design logo, which she wants prominently displayed in a way that will make it one of the first things that comes into view for those arriving by elevator.

Professor Gonnella has many good reasons for wanting Rob Busch’s name to be highlighted and recognized. “I can’t imagine life without Rob Busch,” she says. “This design school could not have been named after a more deserving person.”

In addition to his financial patronage, she says, Busch has been generous with his time and his expertise as the owner of a business whose mainstay is printing and graphics. “He truly cares about the students and what they are actively learning and doing,” she says. “He is personally invested in watching the hopes and dreams of the students come to fruition.

“He comes to their portfolio reviews and events such as our Thinking Creatively annual conference,” she continues. “He invites groups of students to All-State Legal for tours of the printing and design facilities. And, very importantly, he helps to create opportunities for students to work on real projects for real clients, which gives them a huge boost when it’s time to start job hunting.”

One of the ways Busch accomplished this was as the founding patron of Kean Cre8tive, a design consortium overseen by Professor Gonnella. Kean Cre8tive functions as an independent graphic design firm, executing projects for clients within and outside the Kean community. (Full disclosure: Kean Cre8tive designed this Annual Report.)

Another way was through his facilitation of a gorgeous textbook called *Design to Touch*, focused on the increasingly uncommon process of engraving as a component of the printing industry. Busch is very involved in the International Engraved Graphics Association (IEGA), and convinced the association to sponsor the textbook as a way of preserving and promoting the engraving process to future specifiers within the graphic design field.

“We were able to have 12 student interns work on the book project,” says Professor Gonnella. “And Rob sponsored four students as part of a visual marketing team that gave a presentation about the textbook and the engraving marketing initiative at the IEGA annual conference in Rhode Island.

“That was an incredible experience for them—and really highlighted Kean within a prominent industry association as a school that is turning out exceptionally well-trained and well-qualified designers who can hit the ground running in just about any professional context.”





KEANLIFT:

Kean University's Own Crowdfunding Initiative

In the last few years, crowdfunding has really caught on as a popular, Internet-based method of raising money to support a wide variety of worthy causes and projects. Kickstarter and GoFundMe are just two of the most popular crowdfunding websites. In the fall of 2012, Dr. Jeffrey Toney, Kean's provost and vice president of academic affairs, suggested that Kean should try to utilize this social media model as a way to solicit support for projects that further the University's mission. And so, Kean University's own crowdfunding initiative, KeanLIFT, was born as a joint effort of the Kean University Foundation and the Offices of Academic Affairs, Research and Sponsored Programs (ORSP), and University Relations.

KeanLIFT made its debut in April 2013 with the goal of raising \$5,000 for PAR FORE, a program that seeks to counteract the influences of gangs and violence among inner-city youth by teaching them the game of golf. Kean's chapter of PAR FORE, facilitated by the Department of Occupational Therapy, wanted to use the funds to support a six-week summer camp targeting at-risk youth from Newark.

Susan Gannon, acting director of ORSP, explains that KeanLIFT leverages the advantages of social media to build bridges between disparate University constituencies including faculty, staff, students, alumni, and friends. "The KeanLIFT site is envisioned as kind of a 'magazine rack' where groups that are running project campaigns can tell their stories," she says. "From this base, the message can spread out from the core Kean community until it reaches a wider circle and creates a comprehensive network of interest and involvement and support."

Gannon points out that the crowdfunding model is particularly valuable for reaching younger alumni and other potential donors who are comfortable with social media, e-commerce, and the concept of virtual communities. "KeanLIFT is opening up opportunities for younger people, particularly alumni, to keep up with what's happening at Kean and get involved in ways that make sense for them," she says.

The PAR FORE pilot quickly proved that the crowdfunding model was a viable one, with the campaign not only reaching but exceeding its \$5,000 goal within its 30-day duration.

The second KeanLIFT campaign was also successful, raising nearly \$6,000 in scholarships for the Robert Busch School of Design's Thinking Creatively Design Camp, to help artistically talented but underprivileged high school students explore possible careers in creative fields.

KeanLIFT expects to launch two new campaigns in the spring of 2014. To have a fundraising campaign considered for KeanLIFT, project managers must submit prospective campaigns through the site, and a panel of 5 reviewers—drawn from University administration, the Foundation, ORSP, and student organizations—evaluates, ranks, and selects the projects. ORSP conducts periodic workshops for faculty and staff to teach them how to put together effective proposals.

“There are no real restrictions, other than that a project must be well thought out and achievable, have a capable team behind it, and support the educational mission of Kean University,” Gannon says.

THE ELIZABETHTOWN HEALTHCARE FOUNDATION

Inspired to Care, Inspired to Give

For children with autism spectrum disorders, early intervention is absolutely critical in order to help them learn the communication skills and social behaviors they need to function among the “typical” population. A social skills facilitation program called Making Friends, administered by Kean University’s Center for Communication Disorders, is providing this instruction to children on the higher end of the autism spectrum, aided by generous funding from the Elizabethtown Healthcare Foundation.

For the last three years, the Elizabethtown Healthcare Foundation (EHF) has donated \$175,000 to the Making Friends program. According to David A. Fletcher, president of EHF, Kean University was awarded funding in order to provide opportunities for the children served by the program to live “well-rounded, enjoyable lives.”

EHF values its roots and heritage of community service in the City of Elizabeth and eastern Union County. The foundation is the descendant of the parent corporation of Elizabeth General Medical Center, the first hospital in the City of Elizabeth, which partnered with St. Elizabeth Hospital in 2000 to create Trinitas Regional Medical Center.

Grants are awarded to institutions in the City of Elizabeth and surrounding communities in eastern Union County to establish or strengthen projects or programs that are central to EHF’s mission. “Kean University fit the criteria for our primary areas of interest with this worthy initiative,” says Fletcher.

The Making Friends program facilitates the development of successful communication skills for peer groups. Social pragmatics is often cited as a core challenge. Persons with autism may say inappropriate or unrelated things or speak to others in a disorganized way. The EHF grant enabled the program to hire a speech pathologist to address the children’s needs and reinforce their progress.

“[These kids] may be talking about the lights instead of engaging in real conversation,” says Clinical Coordinator Susan Mandel. “They don’t really know how to play.” Children can learn to become comfortable and successful in social scenarios through the program’s assistance. They are placed into groups which meet twice a week for one hour. Times are scheduled in the late afternoon to accommodate school schedules.

“This is a time to be social with their peers,” Mandel says. “They become part of a group, learning how to take turns and read one another.”

Parents are consulted in order to identify areas of concern. To determine appropriate groupings and develop individual goals, children may be evaluated using a parent questionnaire, interview, and formal assessment tools. With parental permission, input may be requested from classroom teachers. Goals are then developed based on parental input, formal assessments, and observation.

Mandel says many students have had serious difficulties forming friendships prior to entering the Making Friends program; now, many of them are acquiring the skills to approach their peers, initiate conversation, and begin to establish continuing relationships. Having others around in a safe environment who understand what they’re going through adds an extra dimension to learning, she says. “The parents love the program.”

“We receive annual reports on all grants at the end of each year,” Fletcher says, “and we were very pleased with the outcome at Kean.”

SCHOLAR / DONOR PROFILE: GAIL HILLIARD-NELSON

In the wake of immeasurable personal tragedy, Gail Hilliard-Nelson, Ed.D., and her husband, Virgil T. Nelson Sr., created something lasting and precious: a way to make the educational path a little shorter and easier for young people not very different from their late son.

GAIL HILLIARD-NELSON is a Kean employee in the College of Education and the coordinator of the Garden State Partnership for Teacher Quality, an inter-university program that seeks to recruit highly qualified teacher candidates from non-education backgrounds to teach in urban school districts. Ten years ago, her son, Virgil Jr., age 16, passed away suddenly of a previously undetected illness.

“It took a few years, but as we worked through the bereavement process, we decided that we should do something to remember him by,” says Hilliard-Nelson. The option of establishing a scholarship at Kean came to her attention, and she investigated further.

“We found that it would not be difficult to do, so we decided to do it,” she says. The first award of the Virgil T. Nelson Jr. Scholarship was made in fall 2009.

She and her husband wanted the scholarship to benefit students who were similar to their son—minority students who were facing and working to overcome challenges.

“Our son was very bright, but did not have an easy time academically—he had a learning disability and struggled in school as a result,” she says.

The scholarship is designated to be awarded to a young man, preferably from an inner city or urban area, who has already demonstrated some success in the academic arena and shows potential for future achievement. The current preference is for residents of East Orange, where Hilliard-Nelson’s parents are from, although that requirement can be relaxed to accommodate promising candidates from other towns.

Hilliard-Nelson is firmly convinced that obtaining a college degree is the only viable option for a person from an impoverished community who seeks to significantly change their life circumstances and economic status. “There are other avenues to potential achievement, such as entrepreneurship and taking online courses,” she says, “but most professional careers will simply not let you get your foot in the door without a college degree.” Additionally, she says, college exposes a student to experiences and concepts that they will draw upon and use as a basis for success throughout the rest of their lives.

Hilliard-Nelson herself represents the third generation in her family to attend college, and the second generation to graduate. Her convictions about higher education were shared throughout her family; her grandparents established a college fund for her, and her uncle, who studied engineering and law and later became a judge and law professor, exerted strong influence on her and others in her generation to go to college.

She was glad to see her scholarship go to its current recipient, Keyquan Hepburn—whose birthday, she notes, happens to be the same as her son Virgil’s.

His parents are very supportive of him, she says, and have encouraged him to take advantage of every opportunity that comes his way—possibly even including a study-abroad experience in China.

“You can see why he is the young man he is when you meet his parents. They’re very genuine, real, down-to-earth, determined people—they know what they want for him,” she says.

KEYQUAN HEPBURN is a young man who seems to have a firm idea of where his education is going to take him in the future—specifically, into the world of business and entrepreneurship. As a business management major, he already has a plan in place and a vision of himself further down the road: as the owner of his own funeral parlor.

Why the mortuary business? “As a child I never wanted to go to funerals, because they were always so sad and gloomy,” he explains. “I believe that funerals do not have to be sad, that in fact they could be celebrations of the people who passed away instead of focusing on their death.” Hepburn plans to work for a period of time in the business after graduation, and then attend a trade school for mortuary science.

Hepburn has known for a long time that he wanted to go into business for himself. “My father had introduced me to his boss, who was an entrepreneur, and he gave me a lot of advice,” he says. “Having that influence at a young age, and being raised around a lot of businesspeople, inspired me to set that goal for myself and pursue an educational track that would enable me to get there.”

Hepburn, who hails from Jersey City, has already worked at various jobs and been rewarded for his efforts to learn and succeed with promotions to positions of leadership. During high school, he worked for an organization called New City Kids Church as a summer camp counselor and tutor; within a year, he was made an assistant team leader, helping with activity planning and training of other teen workers. At Kean, he secured a desk assistant position in one of the dorms, and again within a year was promoted to desk manager. He currently juggles responsibilities as a resident assistant and operations employee at Kean’s University Center.

His work ethic and talent for cultivating and relating to other people have served him well in the classroom. One of his professors describes him as an “outstanding” student who “has the ability to make people in the room happy.” He also applies his energies within his fraternity, Phi Beta Sigma, where he stepped up to assume not one but two leadership positions, as Interest Advisor and Program Coordinator.

Hepburn decided on Kean after taking a college tour during high school with New City Kids Church. “We had a private tour with some of the Kean students who had worked at New City before,” he says. “They showed us all around the campus and I loved it. The people were friendly, the place was well maintained, and it was the right distance away from home. I was also impressed by the relationships that my friends told me they had built here and how much they were enjoying their college experience.”

With only one working parent supporting a household of five, Hepburn has needed to find ways to relieve the financial obligations of his college education. His on-campus job helps cover some of his expenses, such as books, and he receives some financial aid, but there are still gaps that need filling.

For Hepburn, and for many other ambitious students like him, scholarships created through the Kean University Foundation make a huge difference and help bring their goals within their grasp.

Recipient, Guy V. Bruce
Endowed Scholarship

“Meteor Mike” is a ray of sunshine at Kean.

Michael Rizzo, a senior meteorology major and recipient of the Guy V. Bruce Endowed Scholarship, has made his mark at Kean University as “Meteor Mike,” delivering daily weather reports on Keancast.

Weather and the dynamics of the atmosphere fascinated Rizzo from a young age. Captivated by the meteorologists on television, Rizzo wanted to explore the world of weather for himself and is happy he did. “I want to be on television and have my viewers learn new things and be inspired by the weather like I was,” he says. At this writing, he’s taken a step closer to that goal by securing a spring 2014 meteorology internship in the weather department at WCBS-TV in New York.



Rizzo grew up in Manhattan and later moved to Staten Island, New York. He chose to attend Kean for a variety of reasons: “I love the community and the people here. Everyone is kind, friendly, loving, and encouraging.”

As the Keancast coordinator within the Earth Science Club, Rizzo and his team deliver forecasts through a variety of social media outlets such as Facebook, Twitter, and YouTube, as well as Kean TV and the university’s radio station, WKNJ-FM. Rizzo is also a part of the Garden State Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (LSAMP), a multi-university consortium funded by the National Science Foundation that is designed to increase the quality and number of students from minority groups completing undergraduate degrees in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). “It’s a great program that really inspires students to succeed further in scientific studies,” Rizzo says.

One of Rizzo’s favorite pursuits at Kean is giving back to undergraduate students as a General Education Mentor (GEM). GEMs serve as co-teachers for the freshman students in the Transition to Kean (T2K) program, helping them develop the skills they need in order to succeed in college. Rizzo also takes the time to provide these students with supplemental math support. “Sometimes many students feel discouraged by math, so I try to bring the power of confidence to them to help multiply their interests,” Rizzo says. “I love being a GEM, although meteorology is still my passion.”

One of his proudest accomplishments is helping to write a grant proposal for the earth science program with mentor and professor

of meteorology Dr. Paul Craft. Rizzo and other students saw a need for upgraded equipment that would help the department improve Keancast, create opportunities for coursework and research, and promote student involvement and professional development. After months of work on the proposal, Rizzo and his team were informed on Research Day in April 2013 that they would be receiving the grant.

“The new equipment, which is known as WSI Max, provides a continuous data feed that helps disseminate important aspects of earth science, especially meteorology,” Rizzo explains. “It helps link student environmental scientists and meteorologists to the Kean community and, hopefully, more broadly to residents of the region via media outreach.”

This multi-talented young man is also a creative artist who enjoys painting and drawing abstract art when he has time.

KEAN UNIVERSITY'S 16TH ANNUAL GALA JUNE 13, 2013

Honoring Dr. Dorothy Hennings H'10, Dr. George Hennings H'10,
“Teacher of the Year” Lauren Marrocco '03 '09, and “Nurse of the Year”
Elisaveta Zaharieva '04 '06

Kean University honored four outstanding individuals at its 16th Annual Gala, held on Thursday, June 13, 2013 at the STEM Building. More than 520 Kean alumni, faculty, staff, supporters, and friends turned out to pay tribute to Dr. Dorothy H'10 and Dr. George '10 Hennings, longtime faculty members and staunch Kean benefactors; Lauren Marrocco '03 '09, New Jersey's “Teacher of the Year” for 2012-13; and Elisaveta Zaharieva '04 '06, who was named New Jersey's “Nurse of the Year” for 2012.

The honorees received Kean's inaugural William Livingston Award, named for New Jersey's first governor, who held office from 1776 until his death in 1790. William Livingston was also a delegate to the Continental Congress and a signer of the original United States constitution. He was the builder of Kean University's own Liberty Hall, which still stands, serving as a museum today.

Marrocco, a fourth-grade teacher at the Edward J. Patten School in Perth Amboy, N.J., received her Teacher of the Year award from the New Jersey State Department of Education. In 2009, she earned her master's degree in educational administration and supervision at Kean while simultaneously completing the requirements of a National Board Certified Teacher in reading and language arts literacy.

Marrocco charmed the audience; referring to the large congratulatory banner featuring her photo that was hung outside Kean's Hennings Hall, she deadpanned, “My mother wants to know what you're doing with it when it comes down, and whether she can have it to put on the roof, so that everyone who flies over our house knows where we live.”

Zaharieva is the director of wellness at Juniper Village, a retirement and assisted living community in Chatham, New Jersey. In October 2012, the Health Care Association of New Jersey, the state's trade association of long-term care providers, named Zaharieva its Nurse of the Year.

Zaharieva thanked Dr. Virginia Fitzsimons, executive director of Kean's School of Nursing—and Zaharieva's first professor—as well as several other faculty members “for guiding me, and my education, with the kind of care and commitment that nursing is all about.”

Dr. Dawood Farahi, beginning his introduction of the Henningses, quoted something he has often heard on his travels to China: “The greatest gift you can give to a child is a good education.” And that, he said, is something you cannot do without a great teacher.

“The two people we honor tonight are great educators,” he said. “Between the two of them, they spent 64 years of service right here at Kean. They met here in 1965, and got married in 1968.

“These two are not only great teachers and scholars; they are also amazing human beings... You will never meet people that even come close to the generosity, dedication, and teaching excellence of George and Dorothy Hennings.”

Dr. Dorothy Grant Hennings, Distinguished Professor Emerita, taught language arts in the Department of Instruction, Curriculum, and Administration until her retirement in 2002. Dr. George Hennings, Professor Emeritus in the Department of Biology, also established courses in astronomy and geology and was instrumental in developing Kean’s program in science education for secondary science teachers. A World War II veteran, he served in the U.S. Army Signal Corps from 1943 to 1946. He retired from Kean in 1987.

The Henningses have pursued an extensive program of philanthropic support of Kean University. On the campus, Hennings Hall and the Dorothy Grant Hennings Lecture Center are named for them. They are active on the Kean University Foundation Board of Directors and proudly support a scholarship endowment that assists deserving students majoring in elementary or science education. The couple received honorary degrees from Kean in 2010.

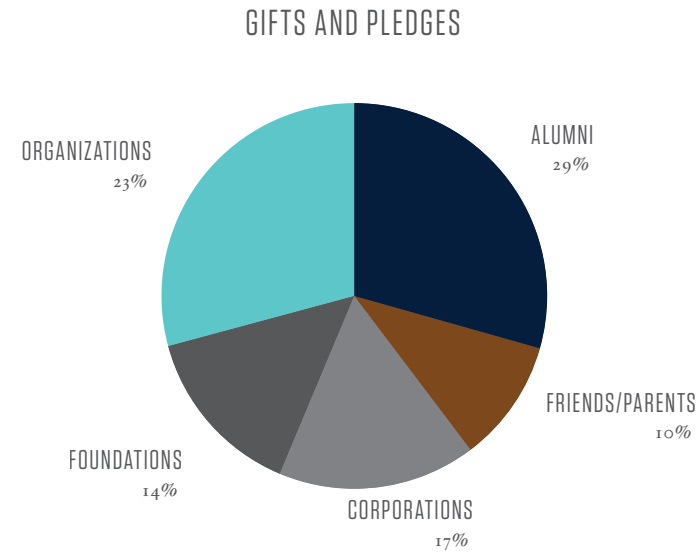

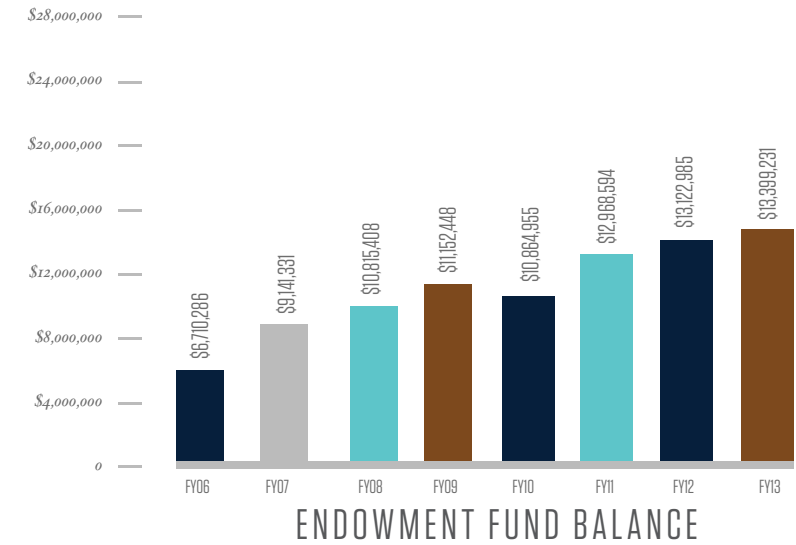
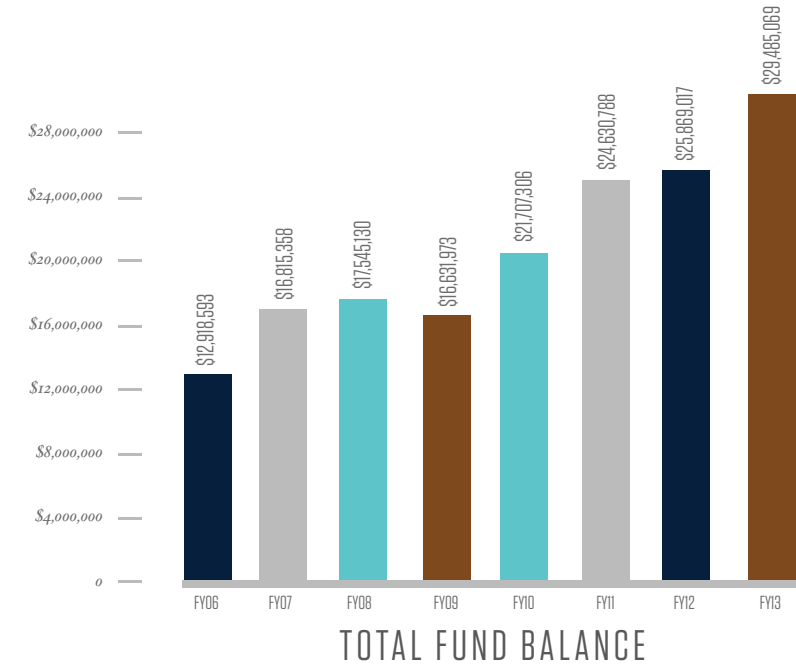

THE 14TH ANNUAL KEAN UNIVERSITY COUGAR CUP GOLF CLASSIC

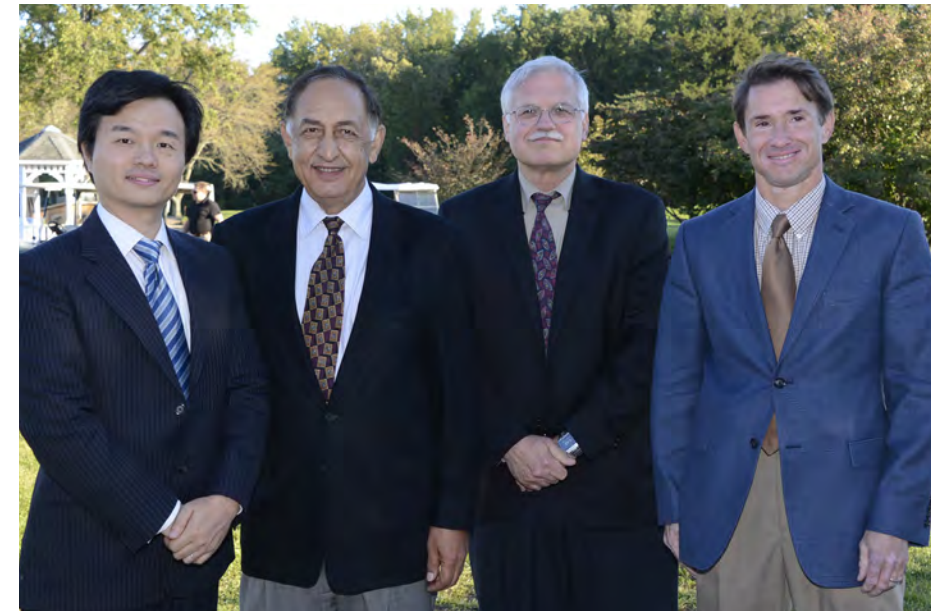

The 2013 edition of this event, held on Sunday, November 17, was no exception.

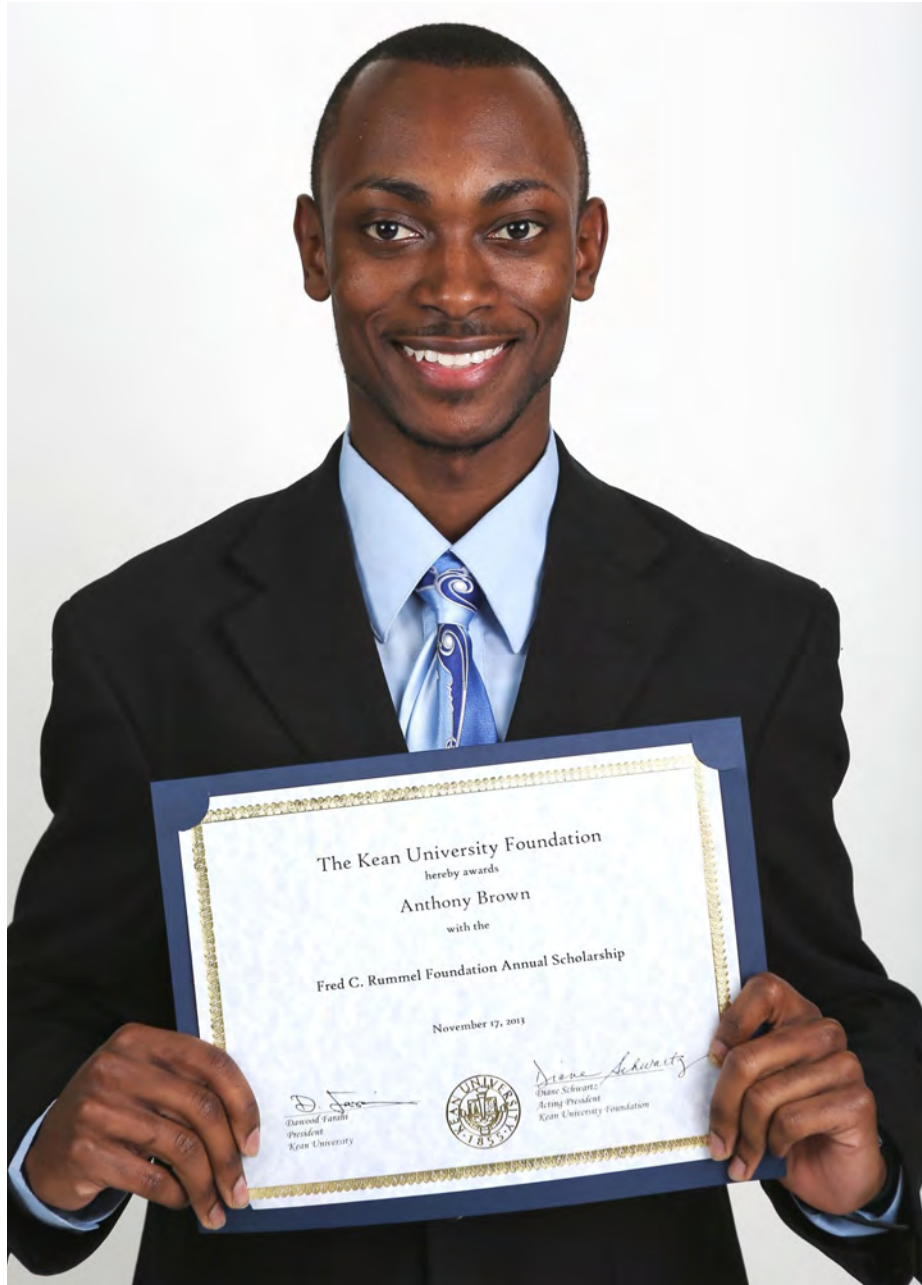

EILEEN MCGRATH / CLASS OF 2014

Eileen McGrath is in her last year of study for an undergraduate degree in English with Teacher Certification. She also has a minor in American Sign Language. In 2013-14, she received both the Nu Theta Chi Alumni Scholarship and Anthony J. Bosco Scholarship in Music.

Dreams of becoming a teacher motivated her as a youngster when she and her sisters would help each other with homework. “I want to help inspire my future students to pursue careers that they will find as enjoyable and rewarding as I view mine,” she says. McGrath believes that being an educator is much more than teaching literature and literacy; she wants to influence the lives and well-being of her students.

Receiving the scholarships took the edge off a hectic schedule that included work, study, and participation in campus activities. McGrath has held as many as three part-time jobs while maintaining a 3.98 GPA. She was inducted into the Sigma Tau Delta English Honor Society and Kappa Delta Pi, an international honor society in education. Her future plans include joining the teaching profession at the high school level and continuing to study ASL. Last March, she interpreted part of the theatre department’s production of “Hairspray” for the audience in sign language.

GERMAN MONTENEGRO / CLASS OF 2015

German Montenegro has proved his willingness to put in the hard work and find the discipline to bring about real change in his life. His grit and determination were acknowledged and rewarded with the Sandra Castaldo Williams Annual Scholarship for Non-traditional Students.

Montenegro, an Information Technology major, previously studied network administration at a two-year institution, but wasn’t satisfied with the resulting prospects. He recognized that a four-year bachelor’s degree would take him much further, so he enrolled at Kean. In his first semester, he took a heavy seven-class course load, and managed a 3.63 GPA of which he is extremely proud.

Montenegro’s first goal is to graduate—not just with a degree, he states firmly, but with honors. After that, he wants to work for “a company where I can grow and help it grow at the same time. I can’t wait.”

In the meantime, he finds stress relief in his other persona: musician. Montenegro, a trumpet player, has played professionally for about seven years with orchestras in the New York metro area.
