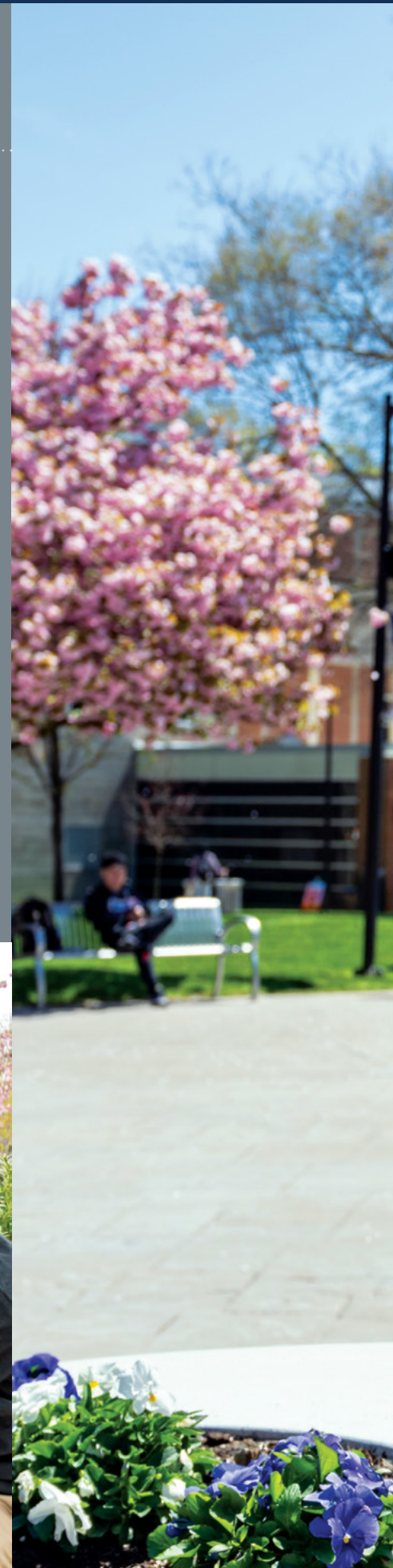



Kean University Welcomes New Deans Jessica Thurlow, Ph.D., and James Konopack, Ph.D.

Kean University proudly welcomes Jessica Thurlow, Ph.D., as dean of the College of Liberal Arts (CLA) and James Konopack, Ph.D., as dean of the College of Health Professions and Human Services (CHPHS).

Thurlow “has a terrific track record in nurturing people and programs,” said Kean Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs David Birdsell, Ph.D. “She has the experience and vision to bring CLA to new heights in the areas of research, teaching and public outreach.”

As for Konopack, Birdsell said his “breadth of experience as an administrator, clinician and scholar matches well with our leadership needs for a College on the move in all of those areas.”

Both new deans spoke to Kean News about the visions for their respective colleges and much more.

Q: What do each of you bring from your prior experience, and how does it compare with Kean?

Thurlow: Across the span of my career, I’ve focused on curriculum development, student success and program growth. I lean into, and believe in, inclusive decision-making practices, listening and learning together to come up with data-driven, student-centered solutions.

Konopack: I launched new programs at Salus and at Monmouth University, where I spent 12 years. I’ve worked in public and private universities, both small institutions and larger ones. That breadth of experience gives me perspective to better serve the Kean community.

Q: Had you ever been to Kean before? What do you like about Kean?

Thurlow: I have family on the East Coast and worked in Manhattan in my 20s, but I had not been to Kean. What drew me originally to the position was Kean’s deep focus on access and affordability,

while also ensuring delivery of a transformative education that supports each student’s professional and life goals.

Konopack: I had not been to Kean, but I grew up in New Jersey and knew of it as Kean College. I love what Kean is doing for students within the state and region. It’s a force for upward mobility and access to expertise and thought leaders.

Q: What are your visions and goals as deans of your respective colleges?

Thurlow: It’s important to nurture and grow programs in the college, creating connections among Kean’s colleges and across campuses. As we think about revising curriculum, it’s important to do so responsibly, ensuring the curriculum is outcomes-based and connects students with employment pathways and real-world experiences.

Konopack: I see CHPHS as a leader for interprofessional education and collaborative, evidence-based practice. I have a vision of the college offering unparalleled access to expertise, to recruit and retain students and cultivate future generations of healthcare practitioners and scholars.

'U.S. News & World Report' Ranks Kean University Among Top in Nation for Social Mobility

Kean University is among the country's top institutions of higher education in social mobility for students, ranking number 26 among national universities in the prestigious *U.S. News & World Report 2023-2024 Best Colleges* rankings.

As the University's national stature in higher education continues to climb, Kean's ranking for social mobility rose from last year, when it was named 46th out of 439 national universities. The category recognizes Kean's success in supporting economically disadvantaged students on their path to graduation.

This is the fifth year Kean has been recognized by *U.S. News* for social mobility of students, and the second year that Kean is on the list of national universities.



"Kean University is committed to supporting students of all backgrounds and socioeconomic levels, and we are proud of *U.S. News*' recognition of our growing success in helping our students achieve their dreams," said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D.

Kean Board of Trustees Chair Steve Fastook H'06 said Kean offers an excellent education, and a world of opportunities, to students.

"Kean University is focused on supporting each one of our students as they work to achieve their goals," Fastook said.

"I am thrilled by the energy on our beautiful campus and gratified by this recognition from *U.S. News*. I know our students, faculty and staff will continue to excel."



Kean University and the New Jersey Devils Establish New Partnership

'A Different World' Comes to Kean University

Kean University welcomed cast members of the iconic TV show *A Different World* to a President's Distinguished Lecture Series event for a discussion of how college life and culture has changed since the sitcom began 35 years ago.

In an auditorium packed with Kean students, alumni and others, cast members Darryl M. Bell, Jasmine Guy, Kadeem Hardison and Cree Summer offered insight and shared memories from the show set in the fictitious Hillman College.

"Look at the past to inform our future – that is the premise," said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D., who introduced the actors to the enthusiastic crowd. "We have similar issues on campus. We have protests. We have Black lives that matter. Is it a different world 35 years later?"

A Different World ran from 1987 to 1993, depicting students at a fictitious historically Black college and taking on issues such as racism, AIDS, apartheid and date rape. "Not a day goes by that someone doesn't come up to us and say, 'I went to college

because I watched *A Different World*," said Bell, who played Ron Johnson.

"I feel a lot has changed, but we're still fighting apartheid. Women are still fighting for the right to our own bodies. There's more representation needed in film and TV," said Summer, who played Winifred "Freddie" Brooks. "We are facing the same problems they were facing."

Guy, who portrayed lead character Whitley Gilbert, and other cast members noted there have been societal changes since the show aired.

"I see more Black representation and gay people on TV than I ever thought I'd see," Guy said.

Kean alumnus Keral Cooper '98, and his wife, Marisa '97, of Edison, said the show gave them a peek into what college life could be like.

"Like so many people here, we grew up on the show," Keral Cooper said. "It was great to hear the actors' perspectives on issues today, related to the show."





Ndaba Mandela, Grandson of Nelson Mandela, Other Activists Issue Calls for Change at Kean Human Rights Conference

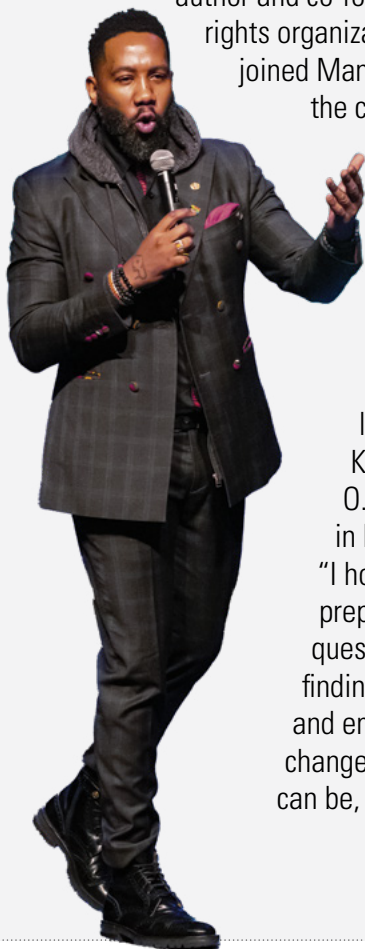
Kean University's 16th annual Human Rights Conference celebrated the 75th anniversary of the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), issuing a powerful call to action: be a changemaker.

The featured speaker, Ndaba Mandela, the grandson of the late South Africa president Nelson Mandela, shared the lessons he learned from his grandfather, a man he said could touch the humanity of every person he met.

"His life is a testament to the belief that standing up for what is right isn't just a choice but a duty," he said.

Sophia Kianni, a 21-year-old climate change activist and United Nations advisor, and John Prendergast, a *New York Times* best-selling author and co-founder of the human rights organization The Sentry, joined Mandela in addressing the conference entitled,

Freedom, Equity and Justice for All: One Person Can Make a Difference.



"Our speakers today have lit the torch and will share their light with you today," Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D., said in his opening remarks.

"I hope that you leave here prepared to ask the difficult questions, committed to finding innovative solutions, and empowered to be the changemakers we know you can be, and we need you to be."



Wilkins Theatre on Kean's Union campus was packed with high school students, Kean students, faculty and others for the conference, which marked the anniversary of the U.N.'s worldwide pronouncement in 1948 that upholds and protects the fundamental rights of all people.

The document served as a "beacon of hope" for the late Nelson Mandela while he was imprisoned for 27 years for opposing apartheid, Ndaba Mandela said.

Margaret Perez, 17, a senior at Monmouth Regional High School, said the conference was "very impactful."

"I feel everybody here probably feels some kind of desire to take action – it really is a call to action," she said.

Michael Bonner, a Kean sophomore from Westfield, said he was "uplifted," especially by Kianni's advice for students to believe in themselves.

"It took me a long time to realize I am the only person that needs to believe in myself," he said.

Kean University Announces Dual Degree Agreement with Howard University

Kean University students now have a faster path to earning a doctoral degree in pharmacy under a new dual degree agreement with Howard University that is designed to encourage more students from underrepresented groups to enter the healthcare field.

Signed during Kean's Black History Month celebrations, the accelerated degree program provides qualified students at Kean the opportunity to begin studying at Howard, one of the nation's most prestigious historically Black research universities, during their senior year.

Ultimately, participating Kean students will earn both a bachelor's degree in chemistry from Kean and a doctorate in pharmacy, or Pharm. D., from Howard in Washington, D.C. in seven years – one year faster than through traditional pharmacy academic programs.

"This landmark agreement with one of the preeminent historically Black universities in the nation is a momentous step in fulfilling Kean's mission as New Jersey's urban research university," said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. "It will bring students from diverse backgrounds into this critical field. As a minority-serving institution, Kean shares profound similarities and deep-rooted values with Howard. We look forward to learning from this partnership and are committed

to strategically aligning with other institutions to optimally support and elevate our students' experiences and opportunities."

Kean Board of Trustees Member Bertha Little-Mathews, a community organizer in Union, emphasized the profound impact of the agreement on Kean students and their communities.

"Kean is not just continuing but significantly advancing its crucial role in promoting equity, while also reinforcing its position as an anchor institution for Union County and beyond," Little-Mathews said. "We are already seeing the strong community impact of Kean's transformation as a research institution and look forward to seeing it grow even further in the years to come."

Under the articulation agreement, Kean students in the chemistry program can apply for the program in their sophomore year. Once admitted, they'll enroll in the first year of pharmacy school at Howard during their senior year at Kean.

After successful completion of their first year at Howard, Kean will accept the Howard credits and award the student a bachelor's degree in chemistry. Students will then progress through Howard's Pharm. D. program and earn their doctorate in pharmacy after successfully completing the requirements.



ILSE at Kean Announces \$4 Million in Federal Awards to Three Companies

Startup and early-stage biotech and life science companies working with the Institute for Life Science Entrepreneurship (ILSE) at Kean University were awarded nearly \$4 million from the U.S. Small Business Administration to advance programs for novel antibiotics and antifungals and for potential new Alzheimer's disease therapeutics.

The developing companies under the ILSE umbrella – Kathera Bioscience, Nanonewron LLC and Prokaryotics – together received \$3.97 million from the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) and Small Business Technology Transfer (STTR) programs, known as America's Seed Fund.

"These programs are the lifeblood of startup and early-stage companies. Promising but unproven technologies require seed funding to de-risk the scientific approach. For entrepreneurs with innovative and exciting ideas, there is often nowhere to go," said Keith Bostian, Ph.D., ILSE CEO and associate provost for integrative sciences at Kean University, where ILSE is located. "Translational research funded by SBIRs and STTRs enable the critical first steps to developing new products for health care."

ILSE supports translational research by providing incubator space and consulting expertise, directly and via a network of global life science experts and a core lab network of research and development service organizations.

Cougar Pantry Upgrades Address Student Food Insecurity

Kean University is fighting food insecurity among students with an upgraded food pantry, offering students online ordering and 24/7 confidential access to food and other essentials.

Located in the Wellness Center in Downs Hall on Kean's Union campus, Cougar Pantry has seen usage increase dramatically since the new system launched.

"We have already experienced an increase in utilization of the Cougar Pantry, and we hope to continue to address and tackle both basic needs and food insecurity at Kean University," said Genique Stanislaus, executive director of the Kean Wellness Center. "The new food lockers increase access for students to retrieve food and basic-need items at a more convenient time for them."

"In America, we do not have a 'food issue.' The issue is accessing food and resources," said Carla Vitola, community care coordinator. "Being able to retrieve items 24/7 gives the working student, the student who is a parent, and the student who does not have a vehicle readily available, access to basic items."

Students choose from many non-perishable foods – soups, pasta and sauce, canned fruit, vegetables, tuna and chicken, microwave-ready meals, quinoa and rice, oatmeal, varieties of beans, peanut butter and much more. Perishable foods – such as frozen beef, fresh fruit and vegetables – are also available, as well as salad kits with lettuce grown on campus at Kean and in the Liberty Hall Gardens.

"I'm excited about the new upgrades," said junior Angel Ihie, a cell and molecular biology student, who is co-chair of the President's Advisory Council. "As a resident on campus, I am deeply grateful for services such as the pantry. The provision of items such as toiletries, food items and my personal favorite, the pop-up career clothing, adds to a richer and less stressful college experience for me."

Kean Using Data from 'Vitality Index' to Support Student, Faculty and Staff Well-Being

Kean University has raised the well-being of its community to a strategic imperative, launching a first-of-its-kind "Vitality Index" to measure student, faculty and staff experiences and draw plans for improving the campus culture.

Kean is the first higher education institution in the nation to team up with EY, the global professional services firm, to build a Vitality Index as a tool for bolstering physical, mental, social and financial health among members of the campus community.

"Kean University has always valued the well-being of its students, faculty and staff, but this new initiative allows us to take that commitment to the next level," said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. "By creating and using our Vitality Index, Kean University leaders are able to use data to take the pulse of Kean community members and work to close any gaps in well-being."

The University began working with EY on the project in 2022, said Kean Deputy Chief of Staff T. Itunu Balogun.

"Kean University's participation with EY to ensure holistic wellness for faculty, staff and students sets us apart from universities across the nation," Balogun said. "Our intentionality on creating a culture of care highlights our focus on the whole person and demonstrates our commitment to the well-being of our entire Kean community."

Kean also renovated its Wellness Center for students with new space for group therapy and launched Uwill, which offers round-the-clock mental health teletherapy. For employees, Kean launched Well-Being at Work, an initiative offering on-campus walks and activities as well as a wellness app called Virgin Pulse. The university also recently renovated its fitness center.



Kean Receives \$800,000 NSF Award to Increase Diversity in Computing

Kean University was recently awarded an \$800,000 grant from the National Science Foundation (NSF) for research aimed at attracting and retaining more diverse students to STEM education and careers through teaching more inclusive software design.

Kean students studying computer science and information technology will learn to design software accessible to more people, said Professor Patricia Morreale, Ph.D., the principal investigator on the grant who is also chair of the Department of Computer Science and Technology.

As part of their classroom work, students will design software for target users from one of several “personas,” each with a mix of different facets, including learning styles, access to reliable technology, risk tolerance and computer ability.

“This approach is really helping all students be better developers and understand more about the people who will use their software,” Morreale said.

The goals of the NSF-funded research are both to improve equity and inclusivity in computer science and information technology education and retain diverse students once they are enrolled.

“Access to STEM education and courses does not ensure equity,” Morreale wrote in the project overview. “Once recruited, students must be successfully retained in STEM majors. Toward this end, we will address the challenges diverse students enrolled in similar courses face.”

The three-year grant from NSF was awarded to Kean as a Hispanic-Serving Institution, or HSI. The research project builds on an earlier NSF grant at Kean, which began the work on teaching inclusive software design.

The project is expected to involve about 20 Kean faculty and reach 2,000 students during the three years.

Kean's Inaugural Assessment Summit Focuses on Closing the Equity Gap

An international expert on assessment and equity gaps in higher education told an audience of faculty and staff at Kean University's first Assessment Summit to "use assessment as a vehicle for equity."

Scholar and author Gavin Henning, Ph.D., a professor of higher education at New England College, was the keynote speaker at the summit.

Calling assessment a "state of mind" that must be embedded into Kean's everyday practices to help ensure equity for all students, he urged the audience to reconsider how they think about student academic performance and success.

"We want to move away from this idea of equity gaps and toward institutional performance gaps," Henning said. "When we focus on student deficits, we tend to unconsciously place the blame on students. If we make a commitment to enroll these students, we are committed to helping them succeed."

The summit, with the theme *Reframing Assessment to Center Equity*, was organized to help develop best practices in assessment to address disparities in student success based on race and ethnicity, gender, socioeconomic status and other demographic traits. It aligned with Kean's participation in the Moon Shot for Equity initiative, a national network of colleges and universities dedicated to eliminating equity gaps in higher education.

Senior Vice President for Administration Michael Salvatore, Ph.D., said the goal of the summit was "to understand how our university works – what processes, systems, pedagogy and outcomes work for some students but not others."

"There is a lot of work to do here. We have the right team to do it, and we are morally obligated to change something," Salvatore said. "Our students are waiting for us to do something different, and now we have data and information to begin to make changes."





Kean Holds First Student-Run Sports Summit

Kean University students, alumni and experts from the world of sports took part in the first Kean Sports Summit last year. The event, hosted by the Kean Sports Business Club and the President's Advisory Council, introduced students to leaders and potential careers in professional sports. More than 230 students attended the event on campus and another 300 joined online.

The Sports Summit brought executives from across the industry – including the New Jersey Devils, New York Red Bulls, New York Jets, Brooklyn Nets, APM Music and more – to meet and network with students and recent alumni. It also featured panel discussions and a keynote address by motivational speaker, education consultant and Kean graduate Brad Butler '14.

Sebastian Salazar, a senior marketing major from Elizabeth, is president of the Kean Sports Business Club and works for both the New York Jets and New York Giants. Salazar said the industry professionals who shared their experiences and advice with the Kean community were amazing. "Everyone here is so influential. They have great career paths. They were so helpful and inviting," he said.

Throughout the day, a career expo gave students and recent alumni the opportunity to speak with potential employers about how to break into the business of sports. Tyler Maisonet, inside sales manager for the Brooklyn Nets, took a moment to speak with Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D.

"This was an event organized by students, for students," Repollet said. "The student turnout was tremendous. I was extremely impressed by the quality of the work the students put into this event."

Farmers and Experts Gather at Kean to Discuss Environmental Justice

Kean University hosted soybean farmers and biofuel industry experts from across the United States for a conference on environmental justice and the potential of biodiesel as a sustainable energy solution.

Clean Fuels Alliance America and Groundwork Elizabeth co-hosted the conference, which was part of a three-day trip to the New York metropolitan area by 35 farmers from 10 midwestern and southern states to learn about biodiesel advancements that can convert waste products from soy crops into fuel for everything from cars to airplanes.

Department of Environmental and Sustainability Sciences (DESS) Chair Daniela Shebitz, Ph.D., said the conference addressed the inextricable link between our food, health and the environment.

“The farmers at this event are taking an essential sustainability step by using the waste products of soy crops and turning them into biofuels,” Shebitz said. “Biofuels offer a lower emission option than fossil fuels and can help protect our health by limiting the amount of pollution in our air.”

Kean students attended the event, taking part in a sustainability group discussion with the farmers. Topics ranged from the environmental impact of growing crops for biodiesel to the consequences of relying on Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs) such as corn and soy, as well as the future prospects of careers in agriculture.

Lauren King, a Kean senior from East Brunswick, said she appreciated hearing from people on all sides of the issue.

“As an environmental biology student, it was enlightening to meet such a diverse group of people with different perspectives on environmental justice and sustainable farming,” King said.

Kean University Offers New Faster Path for Adults Returning to College

Kean University has opened a new streamlined path to a college degree for students with prior credits through the University’s online Global Education and Resource Campus tailored specifically toward returning students.

The online campus offers students ages 25 and older who are not currently enrolled in college the chance to earn credit for professional or military experience and industry credentials, reducing the time and cost of earning their degrees.

“Kean offers a new beacon of hope for those seeking a second chance to fulfill their academic dreams with the introduction of the Kean Global Education and Resource Campus,” said Kean President Lamont O. Repollet, Ed.D. “This initiative will uplift individuals, families and communities, including historically marginalized communities of color, by giving students a way to finish what they started. Education is the great equalizer. Through this new program, everyone gets a shot at unlocking their potential.”

Statistics show 43 million Americans have accumulated some college credits without graduating, a societal issue that particularly impacts communities of color, as well as poor and rural communities that have historically faced systemic barriers to college access and completion.

“Kean University is driven by a commitment to access and equity, and our mission as New Jersey’s urban research university inspires and equips us to address disparities that have historically kept underrepresented groups from achieving their college degrees,” said Joseph Youngblood, II, Ph.D., senior vice president for transformational learning and external affairs. “We know that valuable, college-level learning takes place outside of the classroom, so we’re also offering students the chance to receive credit for those experiences, which will be a game-changer for them.”



Bestselling Author Tabitha Brown Wows Crowd in Kean President's Distinguished Lecture Series

Emmy winner, *New York Times* bestselling author and vegan foodie Tabitha Brown brought her upbeat message of authenticity – with a dash of cooking advice – to the Kean University President's Distinguished Lecture series.

Speaking in a sold-out auditorium with Kean students, faculty, alumni and community members, Brown described her journey from her North Carolina childhood to her Hollywood success and offered advice to the audience.

"Be authentic. Be who you are," she said. "The best way to reach success is being true to yourself."

At both the lecture and student session, enthusiastic listeners lined up to ask Brown about maintaining authenticity, having confidence to pursue goals, and eating and staying healthy.

"I thought they were amazing," Brown said about the Kean students. "Somebody's doing the right thing here."

The scholarship, created by Roig and his family, was announced at the January 25 opening of his solo exhibition, *Layers of Life*. The Roig Family Art Scholarship is an endowed fund providing scholarships for students majoring in fine arts at Kean.

Empowering Tomorrow: An Alumna Legacy Through Scholarship

James "Jim" Murphy first set eyes on Karen Beth Kulig at a Dunellen High School football game in 1966. She was a twirler and he felt "magic" the instant their eyes met. Two weeks later, at a dance at the Dunellen Firehouse, Jim and Karen saw each other again, and with that same magic in the air, Jim eagerly walked up to Karen and asked her three questions: "Can I have your phone number?," "Will you go out with me?," and "Will you marry me?." Karen responded to the latter two questions with a hesitant look, then continued to write down her number with an eyebrow pencil – which Jim still has today.

Jim and Karen were married five years later, but not before Karen attended Caldwell University, where she received her teacher's certificate in history for secondary education. Karen and Jim then raised their family in North Plainfield: a son, James, and a daughter, Erin.

Karen always felt her calling was to teach elementary students, so she decided to attend Kean University, where she received her elementary certification. Like many Kean students, Karen took classes at night while working during the day. Jim would drive her to classes and spend time studying in the library while he waited. He fondly remembers the excitement of watching Hank Aaron hit his 715th home run on Kean's campus in 1974!

Karen went on to teach fourth grade at Our Lady of Mount Virgin in Middlesex, and later became a first- and second-grade teacher at Vander Veer Elementary School in Somerville, where she was named Teacher of the Year in 2006.

On June 25, 2021, the day before the couple's 50th wedding anniversary, their son Jim suffered a medical emergency. Three days later, Jim was diagnosed with glioblastoma. The next morning, Karen suffered a debilitating stroke. Despite Karen's medical services getting discontinued after her time in the hospital, Jim and the rest of the Murphy family refused to give up and reached out to various other institutions for help, including Kean University.



Their phone call to Kean was not only answered but met with empathy, optimism and resolution. Dr. Claire Mulry, Patricia Higgins and the entire Occupational Therapy staff welcomed Karen and the Murphy family with hope and enthusiasm. When other institutions ignored the family's calls or turned them away, Kean University's Occupational Therapy team did not hesitate to provide support. Karen's time receiving Kean's clinical services became an experiential learning opportunity for the Occupational Therapy students, which included tasks like using a pivot disc to enter and exit the car.

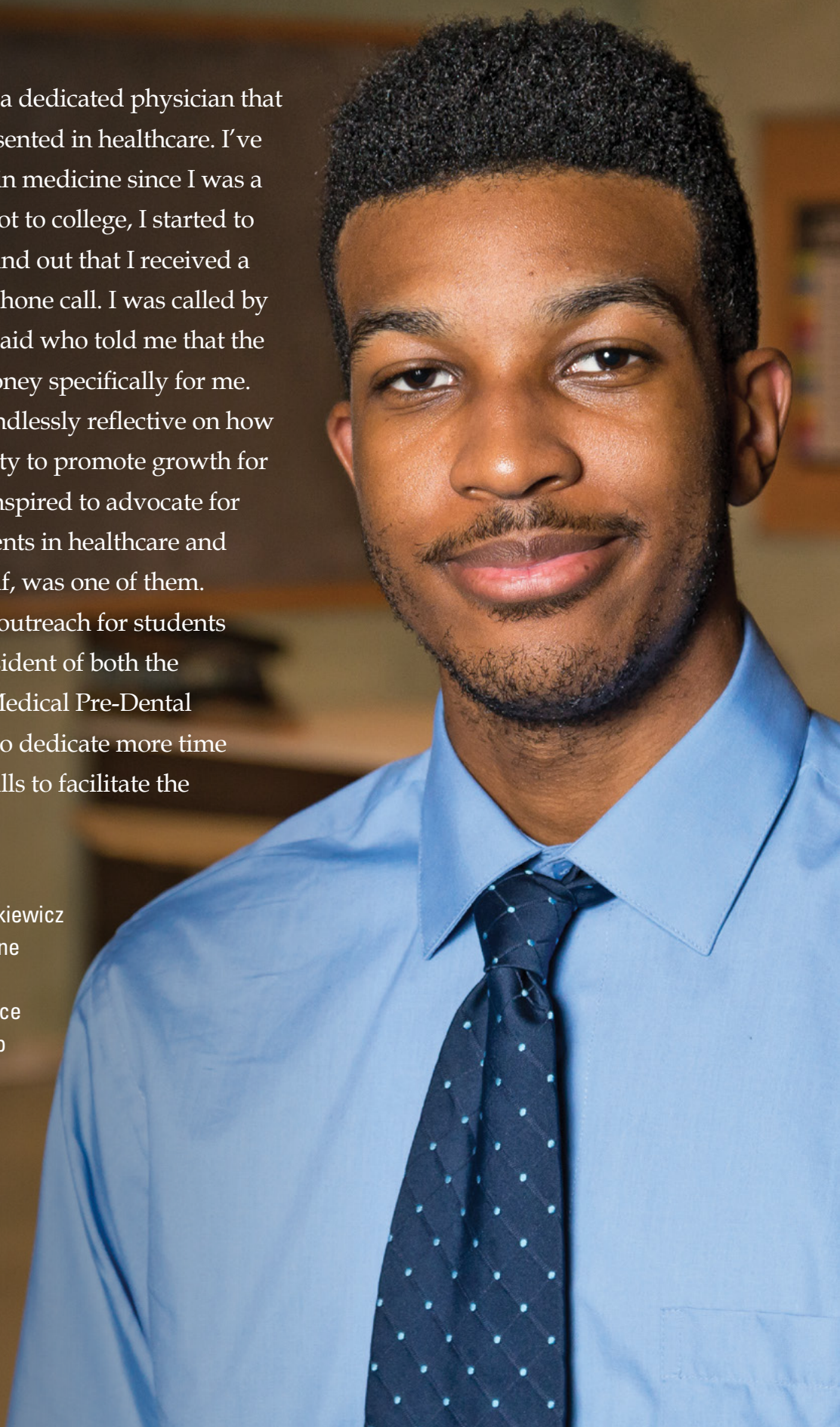
Unfortunately, Karen passed away due to complications from her stroke in December 2023. The care and attention that Kean's Occupational Therapy Department demonstrated to the Murphy family and the opportunities the family provided for students at Kean in return were beyond measure. As a way to both remember Karen and support the future students of Kean, the family wishes to express their gratitude for the support of the Occupational Therapy staff by creating the Karen Beth Murphy Memorial Scholarship.

The intention of the scholarship is to help students with financial burden while showing gratitude for the help and professional level of care received from the department's staff. Gifts such as the Karen Beth Murphy Memorial Scholarship will continue to help Kean students receive the world-class, innovative education for which the university continues to be known.

“My dream is to become a dedicated physician that helps those underrepresented in healthcare. I’ve always been interested in medicine since I was a young kid, and once I got to college, I started to fulfill that journey. I found out that I received a scholarship through a phone call. I was called by the director of financial aid who told me that the donor had given the money specifically for me. I was in awe, and I’m endlessly reflective on how I can use this opportunity to promote growth for future students. I was inspired to advocate for underrepresented students in healthcare and science because I, myself, was one of them. I wanted to provide an outreach for students just like me. As the president of both the Biology Club and Pre-Medical Pre-Dental Association, I was able to dedicate more time using my leadership skills to facilitate the doctors of tomorrow.”

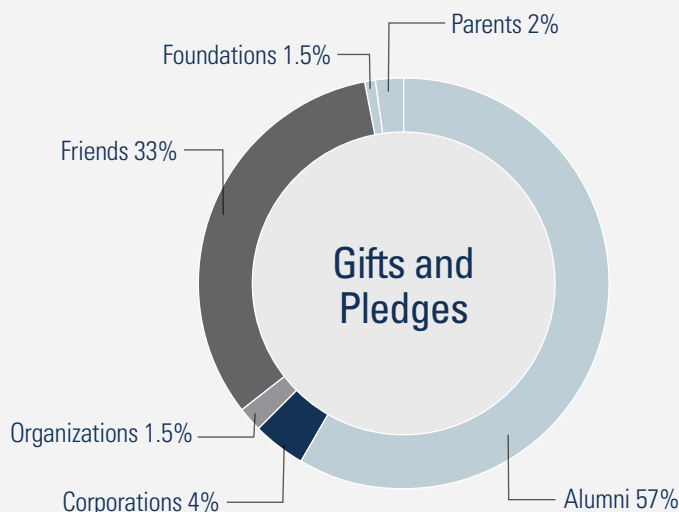

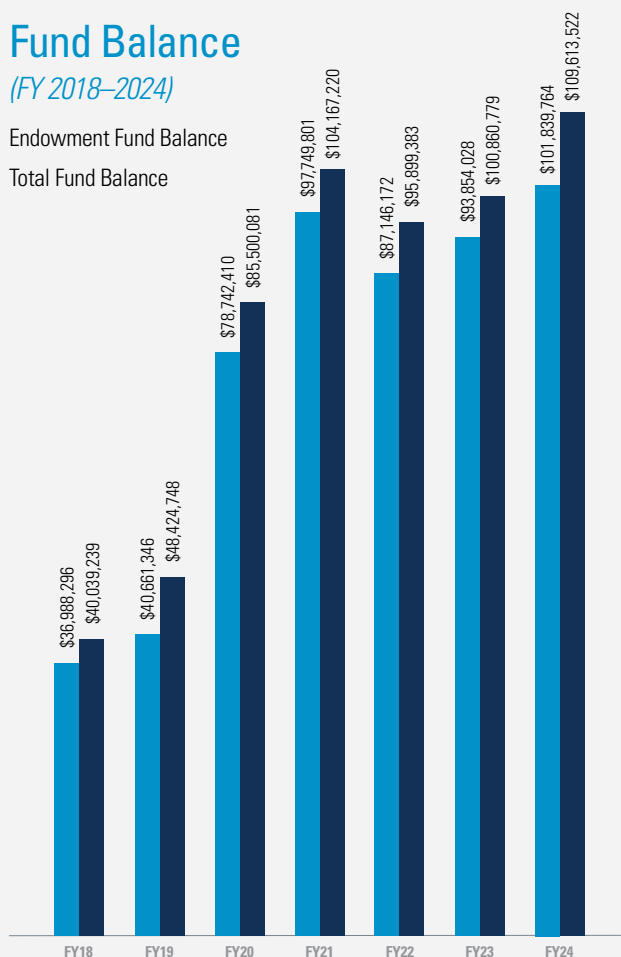

- Total Fund Balance



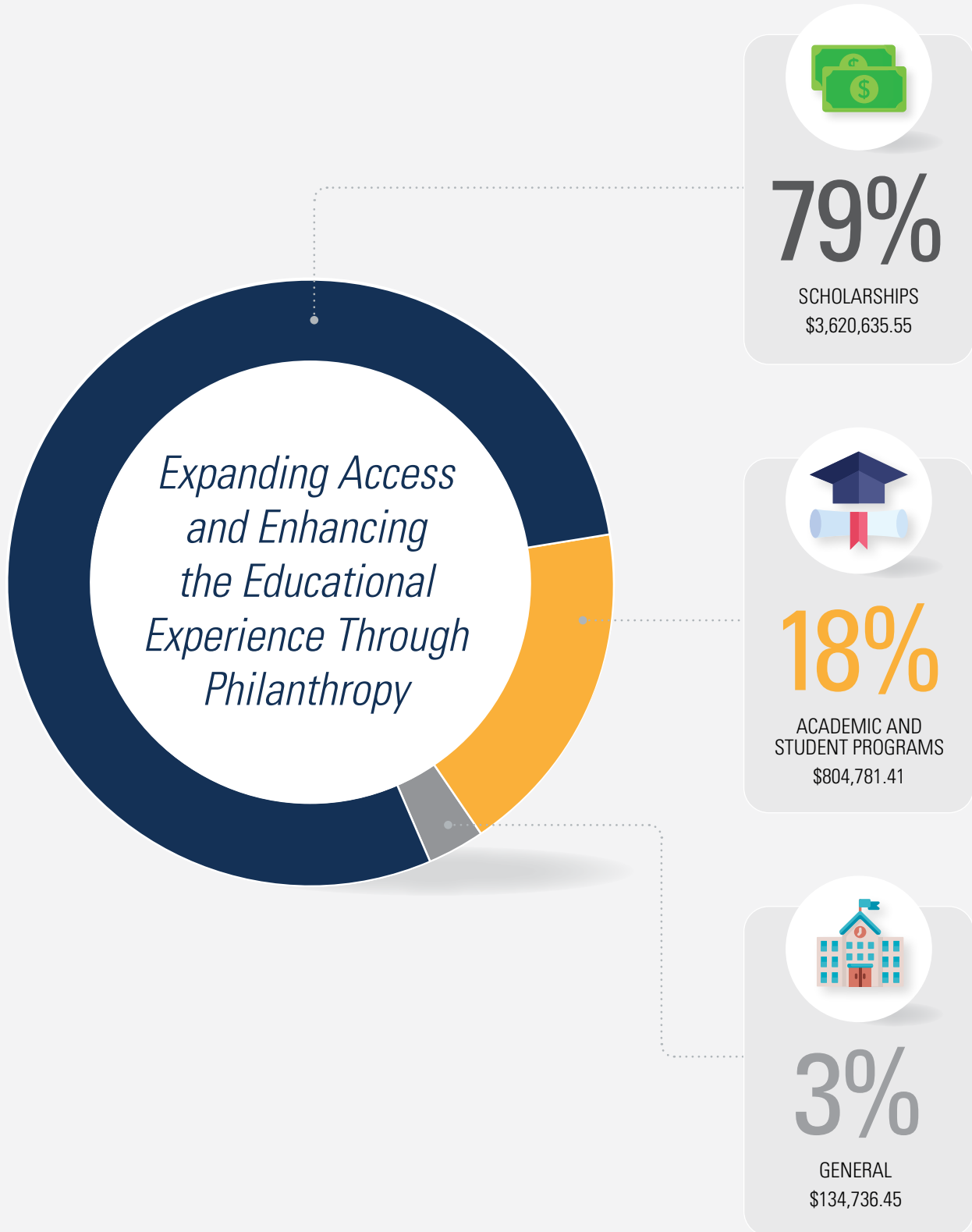
