SPOTLIGHT ON: Kean University Alumna Ina Giardina '63 '67

Luck, Passion and Generosity Combine to Create an Impactful Legacy for Kean University Alumna Ina Giardina '63 '67

According to Ina Giardina '63 '67, it was plain luck that led her to attend Kean University, which was then Newark State College. She began her college career at Jersey City State College. However, soon after, Ina relocated from Newark to Elizabeth, New Jersey. She then discovered that Newark State was within walking distance of her new home and made the decision to transfer schools to save on commuting costs. Ina completed her bachelor's degree in Elementary Education at Kean and began a career in teaching.

It was, it was a bit providential that Ina became an educator at all. She does not recall particularly enjoying school in her youth and, while her parents encouraged her to study and do well, they did not have much educational opportunity themselves. Therefore, they did not know how to guide Ina in the direction of higher education. It was during her high school years that her life's direction began to take shape. "I had really great teachers at Weequahic High School, located in Newark," she said. "A number of them held doctorates and I admired their enthusiasm and dedication." Ina began enjoying learning and, when her peers began to apply to college, she decided she should as well.

Following her graduation in 1963, Ina became one of those really great teachers herself. She obtained a position in the Newark school system and it was not long before she was back on Kean's campus, pursuing her master's degree in the evenings after teaching all day. Upon achieving her advanced degree, she was offered the opportunity to specialize in English as a Second Language (ESL) at a time when bilingual education was becoming a national norm. Ina challenged her students and succeeded in helping them – and, by extension, their families. Was this timing lucky? No! Rather, it is an example of finding opportunities and pursuing interests that can become passions. It is a trait that Ina exemplifies and inspires in others.



Several years ago, during Ina's teaching career, she received a gift of a beautiful antique sterling silver and ivory bracelet. She loved it so much that she went to the antique shop to see if there would be earrings available to compliment it. The dealer had a necklace and earring set that was perfect – but could only be sold as a set. Ina purchased the set, keeping the earrings and selling the necklace to a friend. Thus began her second career as an antiques dealer. After retiring from teaching, what started as a "side-gig" has now become a full-time profession and passion. Ina's expertise in finding unique treasures can be seen at her shop in the <u>Summit Antiques Center</u>, which carries a wide range of timeless furniture, art, jewelry and more.

Another interest which has become an important part of Ina's life is her involvement with the Kean University Foundation. She reconnected with Kean during a class reunion celebration and was impressed by the University's growth. Ina began attending Kean's theater performances and art gallery exhibits, often joking that her attendance now makes up for the fact that she did not have the time to take advantage of many extracurricular offerings while working full-time as student. She volunteered to serve on Kean's former University Arts Council and has been a consistent supporter of the Kean Fund for Excellence. When asked what motivates her support, Ina stated, "Kean gives a lot of people the opportunity to fulfill a lot of their aspirations. I am happy to help keep it going and growing."

To continue to impact Kean students' success, Ina has thoughtfully provided for a legacy gift in her estate plans. Her planned bequest will benefit student scholarships. Ina was inspired to make this arrangement given her interactions with her own students and with many Kean students over the years. "There is always a need for financial assistance; a little outside help can make a big difference," she stated. In fact, a little outside help makes an immeasurable difference! As the students who have received support graduate and follow opportunities that become their passions, they will impact others around them, just as Ina has. The Kean University Foundation is grateful – and lucky – that Kean became part of Ina's life journey and, through her thoughtful planning, a place where her legacy will continue forever.



Faculty Spotlight: Claire M. Mulry, OTD, OTR, CAPS, FAOTA

Chairperson for the Kean University Department of Occupational and Associate Professor



From murals to meals, classrooms to community, Dr. Claire Mulry's dedication to and passion for her Occupational Therapy students at Kean University, as well as older adults in the community, are hard to match.

Dr. Claire M. Mulry (she/her/hers) is the 8th Chairperson of Kean University's Department of Occupational Therapy. She has been a practicing occupational therapist for over 27 years. Dr. Mulry received her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Rutgers University in 1988 and her Post Baccalaureate Certificate in Occupational Therapy from Kean College in 1997. She received her Certified Aging in Place Specialist (CAPS) from the National Association of Home Builders in 2009 and her Post Professional Master of Science in Occupational Therapy from Quinnipiac University in 2010. Dr. Mulry earned her Post Professional Doctorate in Occupational Therapy (OTD)

from Thomas Jefferson University's School of Health Professions in 2012. She was awarded the American Occupational Therapy Association's (AOTA) Roster of Fellows Award (FAOTA) in 2021.

Dr. Mulry's passion is to promote participation and engagement in meaningful occupations for all. Her research interests include aging and participation, acquired brain injury, inter-professional care and program development. Dr. Mulry has received outside grants totaling more than \$2,000,000 from the New Jersey Building Our Future Bond Initiative, AARP Community Challenge, AARP New Jersey and Roselle Senior Housing. She has received Kean University grants including the Quality First Initiative Grant in 2017-2018, Students Partnering with Faculty Grant (SpF) in 2016-2017 and Foundation Faculty Research Awards in 2015-2016 and 2016-2017. Dr. Mulry and a team of student researchers implemented her Let's Go Program to promote community mobility for older adults in seven urban residences and in the community for clients living with chronic mental health concerns.

Currently, Dr. Mulry is launching a new initiative entitled "Resilience Through Relationships and Recipes" thanks to the generous support from the Grotta Fund for Older Adults. Resilience through Relationship and Recipes is a collaboration between Kean University's Department of Occupational Therapy (OT) and the Housing Authority of the City of Elizabeth (HACE). This project creates new and innovative pilot programming to increase health and quality of life for older adult residents of HACE by helping them reengage in social participation through intergenerational community building. It targets multiple goals, social connectedness, increased health and quality of life.

Dr. Mulry has also been the recipient of the New Jersey Occupational Therapy Association's President's Award (2014), Award of Merit (2014), Service Award (2014, 2012, 2010) and Nathan Weiss Graduate College Excellence in Graduate Faculty Award (2016). Her occupational roles, in addition to OT, OT educator and citizen, include wife, dog mom, sister, friend, aunt and Grauntie. Dr. Mulry's leisure pursuits include hiking, reading, board games, roller coasters, music and concerts and theater, as well as being an avid Mets fan.

Kean Athletics 3rd Annual Golf Outing

We are grateful such a dedicated group of Cougars once again braved the summer heat and helped make this year's event a roaring success!










Student Spotlight: Nikye Jennings-Jackson
